COMING SOON... Wakeboarding on the Trinity!

Cowtown Wakepark is the nation's newest wakeboarding park, and the first one ever to be built in a downtown environment. The park uses a cable system to pull people of all skill levels across the water without the need for a boat. The cable system and club house will be built along the Trinity River between Northside Drive and Samuels Avenue. Cowtown Wakepark consulted the Trinity River Vision Authority early in their planning phase to discover ways to successfully incorporate their business into the trail system. Cowtown Wakepark's clubhouse will integrate with a trailhead being built by the Tarrant Regional Water District (see below) making their restroom facilities available to trail users. The park is under construction now and is expected to open in the Spring of 2011.

NORTHSIDE DRIVE TRAILHEAD

Neighborhoods: Northside, Downtown, Trinity Uptown

The new trailhead will enhance the river connection between the Northside, Downtown and the future Trinity Uptown communities. It will have fabulous skyline views and offer trail users another spot to enter the Trinity Trails, grab a sip of water on-the-go or sit down and take a breather.

Trailhead construction is underway now and is expected to be completed in 2010.

Go Chasing Waterfalls

Did you know that the Fort Worth area had its very own babbling natural waterfall?! Up until recently, most did not. But now, as a result of brand new trails and pedestrian bridges connecting the hidden gem to the main Trinity corridor, more and more people are setting out to explore this scenic location. Off of nearby Pumphrey Drive, a new trailhead will also be constructed, providing the men and women serving at the Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base, the Ridgmar neighborhood, Westover Hills and Westworth Village with a nearby spot to conveniently hop on the trails and enjoy the waterfall and beyond!

Construction is underway now and is expected to be completed in Fall of 2010.

Fun on the trails is just a short cast away!

This popular section of trail between Rogers Road and University Drive (near Hoffbrau Steakhouse) will be receiving a brand new trailhead that will serve the growing needs of this river-centric community. This trailhead will give trail users the ability to kayak or canoe through Trinity Park from a riverside boat launch, throw in a line from a spacious fishing pier or travel down upgraded trails to premiere shopping and entertainment on University Dr. Modifications have also been made to the trails surrounding this trailhead to ensure that the journey to this new hot spot is a safe and enjoyable one for those who visit or live in the Colonial Hills, Park Hill, Mistletoe Heights and the TCU area.

Construction is underway now and is expected to be completed in the Fall of 2010.

While this beautiful park continues to attract new visitors, a master plan has long been in store and will truly transform this linear park into a truly great destination for all of Southeast Fort Worth. With additional trailheads, trails and numerous community-recommended recreational amenities, the plan provides trail access to the neighborhoods of Morningside, Hillside Morningside, Burchill and Glen Garden.

Construction is expected to begin in the fall of 2010.
