A Modern Twist on TRV Bridge Designs

On a mission to design new bridges that are both beautiful and budget-friendly, the City of Fort Worth and local engineering firm Freese and Nichols, Inc. have assembled a distinguished team that includes internationally-recognized bridge designers Rosales + Partners out of Boston to create a stylish entrance into the urban, waterfront community of Trinity Uptown.

The bridge design team is working side-by-side with a dedicated citizen advisory group to ensure that community needs remain at the forefront of the design process. A major goal is that the bridges – which will cross over the future bypass channel at White Settlement Rd., Henderson St. and Main St. – will provide a pedestrian-friendly experience and complement the iconic architectural components of the Cultural District and Downtown.

The designs that have been released have been described as clean and modern yet suggestive of the arches of the existing Lancaster Ave. and Main St. bridges. The V-shaped pier design is inspired by local architecture found at The Modern Art Museum of Fort Worth and the Pier 1 Imports/Chesapeake Energy headquarters – enhancing the sense of connection between Trinity Uptown and Fort Worth’s most cherished cultural hubs.

While the bridge design team works diligently to make sure crossing over into Trinity Uptown from the Cultural District and the Historic Northside is an experience as unique as the project itself, the TRV project team continues to prepare for the start of bridge construction which is currently scheduled to begin next year.

CONCRETE REMOVAL

Construction Keeps Moving in Central City



More dirt moving has begun (about 45,000 truckloads to be exact!) along the Trinity River between Northside Dr. and Samuels Ave. This time the work will not only create crucial flood storage, but will also transform the area where the City of Fort Worth auto impound used to be into a trailhead with skyline views that will provide enhanced trail access to Northside area neighborhoods like Diamond Hill.



Cutting Project Costs in Gateway Park

The TRV project team came up with a brilliant way to cut project cost – they found someone who would work for free! Well, sort of. What is being called a “voluntary soil removal program” has been established with local contractor will save the project a whopping \$6-8 million. Crews will continue to remove soil from a 100-acre site in Gateway Park’s Riverside Oxbow, but they get to keep the soil and sell it for a profit. The work is being done to enhance flood control and restore the area back to its natural bottomland hardwood condition – the perfect growth condition for the 80,000 trees that will be planted in the park. The area under construction will also be home to numerous soccer fields, a splash park and covered basketball courts. Trinity River Vision Partners Take Home Top Awards for Excellence on the Trails

The Trinity River Vision and partner Streams and Valleys, Inc. both walked away from the Texas Trails Network Conference in February with high honors.

The Texas Trails Network awarded the Trinity River Vision its top annual honor, the “Great Texas Trailhead Planning” award, which recognizes successfully completed trail planning or design projects that utilize public input to significantly enhance a region. The Trinity River Vision partners have done just that through the successful completion of numerous improvement projects related to the 90-project plan officially known as the Trinity River Vision Neighborhood and Recreation

Enhancement Plan. This plan is already underway and provides improved river access and recreation to neighborhoods throughout Fort Worth.

Streams and Valleys, Inc. was recognized for its excellence in the promotion of the Riverside Trailhead and received the “Great Texas Two Step” award. This award recognizes creativity in and quality of trail promotion efforts that provide public exposure in the field of trail use, planning, design or project implementation. The Riverside Trailhead, a Trinity River Vision project, is complete and serves the Historic Riverside neighborhood of Fort Worth.
