I. Call to Order

President Maenius convened the meeting at 9:35 AM with the assurance that a quorum was present.

III. Public Comment

IV. Presentations

P1.

Kate Beck, TRWD Program Director, provided a local partner update on the North and South Bypass Channel projects to include, the South Bypass Channel 60% Design Plan, the Gates and Pump Stations 30% Design Plan, the issuance of \$50 million in TRWD bonds, CFW's annual request for reimbursement, and the status of the Local Central City Budget Reallocation. Ms. Beck also announced that USACE received \$20 million in additional funds for the project and appointed Donovan Blakeley as their new Program Manager. On a motion made by Director Hill, and seconded by Director Cooke, the Directors voted unanimously to receive and file the update presented by Kate Beck.

P2.

Clair Davis, CFW, Senior Capital Project Officer, provided an update of CFW projects, starting with North Bypass Channel-related projects, to include the Part 10 License 2A Project and the Grand Ave Stormwater Project. Regarding the South Bypass Channel, Mr. Davis discussed the Part 13, Part 14, Greenleaf, and Viola stormwater projects. Mr. Davis concluded with an update on the North University Dr Project. On a motion made by Director Hill, and seconded by Director Cooke, the Directors voted unanimously to receive and file the update presented by Clair Davis.

P3.

Kate Beck, TRWD Program Director, and Clair Davis, CFW, Senior Capital Project Officer, provided an update on Panther Island Development. Ms. Beck began by explaining how HR&A has been contracted to help develop recommendations around governance. TRWD is undergoing a Value Engineering study of the canals, after which, it will issue a Request For Proposals for the next phase of canal construction and installation. A canal connection fee and a canal manual are currently being developed. A new Interlocal Agreement between TRWD and CFW is also being developed. Ms. Beck concluded by announcing that the creation of a Public Improvement District is eventually anticipated. On a motion made by Director Hill, and seconded by Director Cooke, the Directors voted unanimously to receive and file the update presented by Kate Beck and Clair Davis.
